

## Overview of privacy-sensitive data

Over 530,000 unique email addresses were found on the server where the data leak occurred. At least 95% of the cases concerned general personal data such as names, addresses, places of residence, email addresses and telephone numbers. In 2% of the possibly affected cases, it concerns data that require further investigation. About 3% of the potentially affected data involved more privacy-sensitive data. Below is a breakdown of this latter category.

Data	Number of cases	Description
Passport or ID number	183	Participants in a running event organized abroad by HAN for its employees were asked to provide their passport number. This concerned participation in the 2015-2017 period. This group was already informed by HAN on 29 September.
Non-encrypted passwords	4381	The server held non-encrypted passwords of online HAN environments that have not been used since 2018. These people were already informed by HAN on 8 September.
Encrypted passwords	5194	The server held encrypted passwords of online HAN environments that have not been used since 2019.
BSN numbers / treatment relationship	407	Participants in a study were offered compensation for their participation. To prevent this compensation from being regarded as income for the participants, this was reported to the tax authorities and a BSN was required. Participants in this study were also asked to give the name of a practitioner. This could be interpreted as a treatment relationship. These data are from 2012-2013.
Registration of a disability	2087	Since 2017 students and prospective students can register any disabilities they have so their disabilities can be taken into account during their studies.
Registration of study delay	1418	This concerns the registration of reasons why students encountered a study delay, which they could register in the 2017-2019 period via a form on han.nl.
Language support	117	In 2015, students could sign up for language support.
Political preference	152	In a 2011 survey conducted by the former student magazine Sensor, participants were asked for their political preferences.
Curriculum Vitae	825	CVs could be uploaded for a matching website for students and employers. These CVs are from the 2009-2019 period
Native language	2	Participants receiving language support were asked about their native language. In 2017 (1x) and 2018 (1x).
